On the 28<sup>th</sup> day of August 2023, be it known that the Board of Emergency Services Commissioners of Williamson County Emergency Services District No. 10 (“District”) hereby adopted, by a majority vote of 4 in favor, 0 against, 0 present-not voting, and 1 absent, to adopt the District’s ad valorem tax rate for the 2023 tax year of \$0.10 per \$100.00 valuation of the appraised property within the boundaries of the District. Per the Texas Tax Code § 26.05, the Tax Rate consists of a separately adopted Debt Rate of \$0.015931 per \$100 valuation, and a separately adopted Maintenance and Operation Rate of \$0.084069 per \$100 valuation and all taxes raised by said 2023 Tax Rate of \$0.10 per \$100 valuation will be used to fund the debt and maintenance and operation expenditures of the District for the next year.

**THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE.**

**WILLIAMSON COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT NO. 10 ADOPTED A TAX RATE THAT WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE.**

**THE TAX RATE WILL EFFECTIVELY BE RAISED BY 8.202 PERCENT AND WILL RAISE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS ON A \$100,000 HOME BY APPROXIMATELY \$6.37.**
